## A round up of Summer: Essential Skills

This term, we welcomed Apostolos from PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP who delivered a skills session to our children based around 2 of our essential skills; Teamwork and Listening. The session involved considering what teamwork means to us and what makes a good team member and the children took part in a number of critical thinking tasks in small groups where they were able to apply their understanding of the importance of working as a team to solve a problem. They then considered the skills required to be a good listener, strategies to use to be a good listener and why listening is so important in the workplace. The children then took part in exercises that developed and rehearsed their listening skills.


This term, Ruby Class were given an opportunity to work on their problem solving skills by being asked to do something to improve the parent room at Cedar for their Careers project.
