The theme for Summer is

'Employability Skills'

What's coming up in the Summer term? Employability Skills

At Cedar, we develop 8 essential skills for employability. These are: Listening, Speaking, Problem Solving, Creativity, Staying Positive, Aiming High, Leadership and Teamwork. Developing these skills prepares children for adulthood by helping them communicate effectively, solve problems, and work well with others. Listening and speaking ensure clear communication, while problem-solving and creativity help tackle challenges. Staying positive and aiming high build resilience and ambition, essential for personal growth. Leadership and teamwork teach responsibility and collaboration. Mastering these skills equips your child to adapt, thrive, and achieve their goals.

What you can do to help:

At home, work on these skills by doing things like: **Speaking and listening:** Encourage your child to communicate with others when out and about

Problem Solving: Guide them through real-life problems using step-by-step thinking e.g. "What's the problem? What can we try?"

Creativity: Support and encourage thinking outside the box **Staying Positive and Aiming High:** Model resilience when striving for goals by showing how to handle setbacks with a positive attitude

Leadership and Teamwork: Give them responsibilities suited to their abilities, like helping with small chores or leading an activity and feeding back to others in the family
