In school we are learning:

Engage in imaginative play based on own ideas using available resources. Exploring textures and other messy materials to express ourselves with a focus on process rather than product. Home learning opportunities:

Get messy! Let your child explore textures such as paint, foodstuffs, gloop (cornflour and water) glue and sand. Dance and sing together, make music by tapping and banging household objects. Encourage small world play and using their imaginations. Dress up and roll play – have fun ©
