Home learning opportunities:

Can they find any other authors that have written about creating monsters? We have many versions of the book in school if your child would like to read it at home-just let me know!

Home learning opportunities:

In this session led by George from Saints
Inspires, the children are learning how to be a
good leader. Are there opportunities for them
to lead at home? It could be they set up a

could plan and lead a family trip out?

In school we are learning: **Target Games** 

Home learning opportunities:

The children can research sports where hitting a target is the objective and maybe even have a trip to try one out (for example crazy golf). The children could also design and make their own target games at home with household items. Even a pillow fight counts!



### **Discovery Days with Emma**



In our discovery days, we will be focussing on humanities, science, RE and creative subjects. In humanities we are learning about World War 2 – when it happened and why, what was life like for evacuees and how did people survive with food rationing?

Home learning opportunities:

Do the children have any relatives who were alive during the time of World War 2? Are they able to speak with them or find out what life was like for them and the rest of the family during this time? Can you look at wartime recipes together and do some cooking using 'rationed' ingredients – maybe comparing to the usual version of a non-rationed recipe?
