


Our Learning Newsletter: Spring 2

 <h3>English</h3>	 <h3>Maths</h3>
<p>In school we are learning: Poetry</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Can your child research to find any poems that interest them, or can you search for a poem you think they will like and read it to them? Maybe have a go at making your own poem with your child- maybe it could be all about their favourite hobby or TV show...</p>	<p>In school we are learning: Geometry and position will be a focus amongst other areas. We will also be finishing our maths exam papers for those completing them! Yay!</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Angles and turns can be very confusing at times. Use language wherever possible to support understanding of this, for example hide their favourite treat and give them directions to find it, such as 'half turn to the left, move forward two steps and then turn right'.</p>
 <h3>PSHE</h3>	 <h3>Computing</h3>
<p>In school we are learning: Families – Understanding what it means to be married, and how to judge when a relationship is unsafe.</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: If possible, talk about the different kinds of relationships people have and how they make it a successful and happy one. What qualities do we need in a relationship?</p>	<p>In school we are learning: Data</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Ask your child to gather data by finding out everyone in the family's favourite food/ film/ colour etc. They can then record it in any way they choose, for example using paper and pen, entering the details into a spreadsheet or saying the information into a voice note.</p>
 <h3>Life Skills</h3>	 <h3>PE</h3>
<p>In school we are learning: Cleaning and cooking!</p> <p>We will be finishing our OCR exam unit on household cleaning and then moving onto cooking healthy and accessible meals!</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Everyone has been amazing at joining in with all the aspects of learning about cleaning- can they tell you about it, or even better- show you?! Get your child to observe and support making dinner. Talk about ingredients and the importance of a balanced diet.</p>	<p>In school we are learning: Invasion games - including Football, hockey, netball and rugby!</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: As the warmer (and hopefully drier!) weather approaches, can children get outside and practise their ball skills? Perhaps go to the park and play a mini invasion game!</p>
 <p>Discovery Days with Emma</p>	 <p><small>Index finger and thumb close whilst moving to the right</small></p>

In our discovery days, we will be focussing on humanities, science, RE and creative subjects. **In our Discovery Days this term we will be learning about Nature, in particular growth & change in Biology. We will learn about the incredible Martin Luther King, and we will also be celebrating World Book Day”**
