











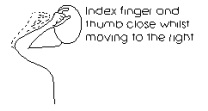


Our Learning Newsletter: Summer 1

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|  <p>English</p>  |  <p>Maths</p>  |
| <p>In school we are learning: English in the real world! We will be using all of our knowledge gained through exam work/ other lessons and bringing it together to support our life skills.</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Provide your child with any opportunity to use their reading, writing and speaking and listening skills at home and out-and-about. This could include calling to order their favourite takeaway, writing the shopping list, proof reading a letter you have written or choosing a recipe from a recipe book!</p> | <p>In school we are learning: Maths in the real world! We will be completing real life projects that need a variety of maths skills.</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Involve your children in everyday maths problems wherever possible. Ask your children to help measure a room to see if you can move the furniture around and it will fit nicely. Ask them to help work out which pack size of their favourite snack is cheapest. How much money could you save if you switch to the cheaper pack?</p> |

| <p>In school we are learning: Consent and Boundaries</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Have open discussions about consent and boundaries with your children. Discuss how it is appropriate to have boundaries in different situations and with different people and how it is okay for these can change.</p> | <p>In school we are learning: Animation</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Which animations do your children watch? Can they find any animations of a different style? Can they find out which animations have won awards?</p> |

| <p>In school we are learning: Baking skills</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Can your child find and taste different types of bread? Read the ingredients on different types of bread... are there any common ingredients between the breads? Can your child have a go at baking some bread at home? We are more than happy to help taste test!</p> | <p>In school we are learning: Teamwork and problem solving skills</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Can your child develop an active game for someone else to play (you, or a sibling/ cousin etc.)? What equipment will be needed? What will the rules be? What is the aim of the game? How will the score be kept?</p> |
