 <p>English</p> 	 <p>Maths</p> 
<p>In school we are learning: Arguments and Letters</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: We are reading the book "Around The World In Eighty Days" so if you go out on the weekends, maybe talk about how far you are going compared to going round the whole world. You can also write a postcard to a friend, or think of where you would like to go in the world. With the weather getting warmer, you could go to the beach and pretend to be in a different country!</p>	<p>In school we are learning: What the time is</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Playing what's the time Mr Wolf is a great activity for this at home, very fun but also reinforces the times. Another option is to start saying the time as much as you can (it's 6:30, time for dinner, it's 12:00, time for lunch etc...) Another game could be to pretend what the time is and make an activity... Pretend it is 2:00 and you are going for a walk in the rain, they should go and find a raincoat or umbrella, or if the time is 8:00, can they go find some milk for their breakfast etc...</p>
 <p>PSHE</p> 	 <p>Computing</p> 
<p>In school we are learning: The Changing Body</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: You could use a doll to talk about what is different at home and what is the same (what's changed). You may want to talk about hygiene as you get older and the importance of showering and wearing deodorant when appropriate. If appropriate, you can have them write a letter to their older self and write about what might be different?</p>	<p>In school we are learning: Inputting Data</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: We are learning about making our own top trumps pack each, so if you have access to this game at home this might be fun to play together. If not, you could try having a creative session where you create funny characters together. You could look at different sets of things, such as types of animals, super heroes, foods, footballers etc...</p>
 <p>Life Skills</p> 	 <p>PE</p> 
<p>In school we are learning: Life around School.</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: Ask your child who they interact with at school! This can be a staff member or a friend. Ask them what part of the school environment is their favourite e.g. ball pit or the sensory room.</p>	<p>In school we are learning: Orienteering</p> <p>Home learning opportunities: We are learning all about where things are in our environment. There are some fab ways to support your child including asking if you are turning left/right when going for a walk. Drawing a map to your local shop. Can they give a brief description of what surrounds your home?</p>
